



#### Introduction and Overview:

A new orchard is being proposed for the Southern Illinois region. This new orchard is to be built on the available 40 acre site in rural Union County, IL, north of Coben, IL and east of Alto Pass, IL. The orchard should be fully functional and must create a captivating environment to draw in visitors. The new educational orchard will provide the following benefits to the visitors, the community, and the region:

- Provide an fun, interactive educational experience for all students and visitors
- Share the knowledge by educating the community and public on the research discovered at the orchard
- Set an example for other orchards and universities to develop a similar educational experience
- Expand the knowledge of younger students on nutrition and how to live a healthier life
- Merge various cultures to create a diverse community where education will thrive.

#### The project will include:

- A [1] Orchard, consisting of a farmer's market, a production facility, recreational storage, a community center, observatory and outdoor storage.
- [2] Multi-use housing will be designed for migrant/field workers, students, and faculty.
- [3] Educational facilities will be dedicated to university students and younger students (kindergarten through high school).

Due to the lack of nutritional education in schools, the orchard will focus on filling this gap by providing nutritional education camps and workshops. The orchard will work on educating the students in the region to help them become knowledgeable on the types of foods they are consuming.

The nutrition camps will be dedicated to children and young adults. The camps will be focused on education of healthy foods and the proper ways to prepare them. The camps will help student become more independent and responsible with their food choices.

The orchard will serve as the feeding factor for the nutrition camps by providing local, fresh ingredients for the students to cook with. It will also be a teaching tool to show students where their food derives from.




## Connection: Orchard and SIUC with Local Surrounding Schools

**EDUCATION FACILITY FLOOR PLAN** 




COMMUNITY CENTER FLOOR PLAN
